■ **SOME OTHER THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT LENT**

The English-speaking countries of the world and Germans, because of the connection with Anglo-Saxon languages, use the word, “Lent” for the spiritual season of preparation that prepares for Easter. The word itself means “Springtime.” It is easy to make a connection with a time to reflect, draw closer to God and be renewed spiritually.

In the rest of the Catholic world, where the influence of the Romance languages is prominent, the more ancient term “The Forty Days” is used: Cuaresma or Cuaresmal. The word “Forty” does not signify an actual 40-day period, but rather approximates it, minus Sundays. The 40 refers to the mystical number referring to its scriptural usage, as a time of testing and failure, like the Israelites wandering in the desert for 40 years. Some failed the test and others met its demands, like Jesus in the story of his Temptations. The Forty Days, or Cuaresma, is the official word that is used in the documents of the Church.

Similarly, the Anglo-Saxon word “Easter” is the name of the Anglo-Saxon goddess of spring; in parts of England the symbol of a rabbit is a sign of springtime fertility. One could see how the word could be used to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus, but that is not the official word that the Catholic Church uses. “Passover” is the official word. It comes to us in its various Romance language forms- Paschal, the Pascha or in Spanish and Italian, Pascua. We say “happy Easter to each other in English but in Latin countries, the greeting is “Feliz Pascua” or “Buona Pascua.” The chocolate industry thus produces chocolate eggs, rabbits and crosses.

**Encountering God's Mercy In Confession Feb. 22 And 23**  
**10:00am-11:30am or 7:00pm-8:30pm**

This week, Fr. Mark Wiesner is here to give our Parish Lenten Mission, “The Spiritual Works of Mercy.” Opportunities will be available to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance one hour after the morning talk-session and one hour before the evening talk-session.

Pope Francis answers two questions in his latest book, “The Name of God is Mercy.” Why are we sinners? It is something that we know from experience, the Pope shares. Our humanity is wounded; we know how to distinguish between good and evil; we know what is evil. We try to follow the path of goodness, but we often fall because of our weaknesses and choose evil.

Pope Francis was asked: what advice would you give a penitent so that he or she can give a good confession? A person ought to reflect on the truth of life, of what he feels and what he thinks before God. He ought to be able to look earnestly at himself and his sin. We need to recognize our need, our emptiness, our wretchedness. We cannot be arrogant, which is the opposite of the shattered heart mentioned by the Church Fathers.

■ **DO SOMETHING LIFE-CHANGING WHEN GIVING UP SOMETHING**

Here is the list from last week’s homily:

**GIVE UP** grumbling! Instead, “In everything give thanks.” Constructive criticism is OK, but moaning, groaning and complaining are not Christian disciplines.

**GIVE UP** 10 to 15 minutes in bed! Instead, use the time in prayer, Bible Study and personal devotion.

**GIVE UP** looking at other peoples’ worse points. Instead concentrate on their best points. We all have faults. It is a lot easier to have someone overlook our shortcomings when we overlook theirs.

**GIVE UP** speaking unkindly. Instead, let your speech be generous and understanding. It costs so little to say something kind and uplifting. Why not check that sharp tongue at the door.

**GIVE UP** your hatred of anyone or anything. Instead, learn the discipline of love. St. Paul wrote that “loves cover a multitude of sins.”

**GIVE UP** your worries and anxieties! Instead, trust God with them. Anxiety is spending emotional energy on something we can do nothing about - like tomorrow! Live today and let God’s grace be sufficient.

**GIVE UP** TV one evening a week! Instead, visit some lonely or sick person. There are those who are isolated by illness or age. Why isolate yourself in front of the “tube”? Give someone the precious gift of your time!

**GIVE UP** buying anything but essentials for yourself! Instead, give the money to God. The money you would spend on the luxuries for yourself could help someone meet basic needs. We are called to be stewards of God’s riches, not consumers of them.

**GIVE UP** judging by appearances and by standards of the world! Instead, learn to give up yourself to God. There is only one who has the right to judge - Jesus Christ.

■ JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY  
February 21, 2016  
Second Sunday of Lent



Many icons depicting Jesus' transfiguration bear the Greek title *Metamorphosis*, a technical term also for nature's springtime transformation. Fittingly, this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* coincides with the Lectionary's Year of Luke, for only Luke specifies Moses and Elijah speaking about Jesus' "exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem" (Luke 9:31). Israel's exodus liberated from slavery; Jesus' exodus liberates from sin's living death of selfishness. Pope Francis suggests that Lent's prayer, fasting, and works of charity can transfigure the world, if Christians translate Isaiah's challenge into our daily lived experience of Jesus' life-giving exodus by releasing those bound unjustly, setting free the oppressed, sharing your bread with the hungry, bringing the afflicted and homeless into your house, clothing the

naked, not turning your back on your own. "If you remove from your midst oppression, and malicious speech . . . then light shall rise for you in the darkness . . . you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring whose water never fails" (Isaiah 58:9, 10, 11).

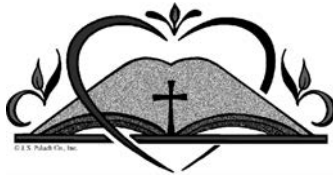

Jesus spoke to us in parables, revealing  
the way through stories. We share the gift  
of storytelling, though we often aren't  
aware of it. Through our stories we can see  
God and know Jesus. We all have stories  
to tell. But we are often not comfortable  
expressing ourselves, especially with pen  
and paper. It may be the memory of late  
nights struggling to finish the high school  
essay or being shamed by a teacher in the  
third grade. Or maybe it's “just not your  
thing,” you're not creative that way.

But writing as a spiritual practice is about  
appreciating that we are created in the

image of God. One of the great and unique gifts God has given each of us is our voice. Yet, we often don't feel comfortable with it. We don't recognize the uniqueness of how God created us.

This day of writing is an opportunity to be present to God through the stories we carry within and to celebrate your relationship with God through pen and paper.

Together, as a community, we will write. What comes may be a funny story, a prayer, a poem, or touching story of love. Each piece is different. The form is not defined. It is inspired. A prompt, which is some form of inspiration such as a poem or item(s), will be given and then the group will be invited to write for a set period of time. Then within a safe and secure environment, we are invited to share our writing. This is an invitation. There is no pressure or expectation, it is only an invitation.

We will write three times with a break for lunch. Due to the sharing nature of the group, we are limited to 20 participants. If you are interested, you can register at the parish office. 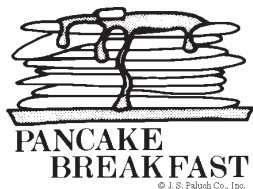
### ■ SAVE THE DATE: MINI PILGRIMAGE TO SAN JUAN BAUTISTA

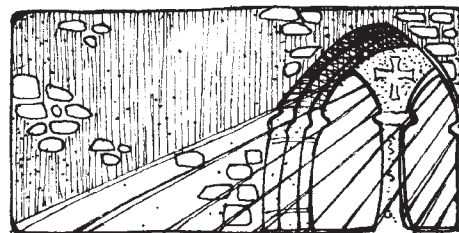

post-weekend sessions. The program, which emphasizes communication, provides the tools to help put marriages in order again. The program offers the

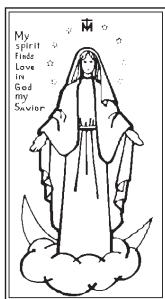

■ **SEGUNDO DOMINGO DE CUARESMA**  
**21 DE FEBRERO, 2016**  
**LUCAS 9: 28-36**

El significado de este hecho en la vida de Jesús, **La Transfiguración del Señor**, significa que Jesucristo frente a la muerte que se acerca encuentra en la oración una fuerza que lo impulsa a entregarse al sacrificio. “Es el Esplendor” de la Nueva, la última y la perfecta **ALIANZA** que Dios pacta con su Hijo Jesucristo, para la salvación de todos los pueblos.

En el libro de Génesis: 15, 1-18 nos habla de la alianza que hace Dios con Abraham. En esta alianza, Abraham no solo recibió la promesa de la herencia de una descendencia tan grande como las estrellas del cielo, sino que la defendió, haciéndola crecer en amor y en la fe. Esta Alianza es sellada con un sacrificio; Dios le ordena a Abraham que tome un cordero, una cabra, una ternera, una tórtola y un pichón. Abraham tomó aquellos animales y los partió por la mitad menos las aves, y los puso una enfrente de la otra y los buitres comenzaron a descender sobre los cadáveres- al sacrificar los animales significaba que la “Sangre derramada” sella el trato.

La mención de los buitres, significa que los poderes del mal se oponen al tratado. El símbolo de Dios pasando entre los animales como fuego es semejante al de la columna de fuego del Éxodo, mediante la cual Dios guiaba al pueblo en el desierto Éxodo 13, 21.

Hoy en el Evangelio, Lucas nos habla de una Alianza nueva y eterna que Dios cumple a través de su Hijo. La Historia del Plan de Salvación de Dios para la humanidad ha sido con la protección de sus alianzas: salva al pueblo con la alianza del inicio de la creación: la alianza con Noé, después continua protegiendo y cuidando al pueblo que vivía en tinieblas; con la alianza de Abraham, más adelante se compadece de un pueblo rebelde que él mismo había liberado de la esclavitud: con la alianza con Moisés en el monte Sinaí, y hoy con Cristo, Dios sella su Alianza eterna para un pueblo que está separado de Dios, lleno de injusticias, lleno de temores, donde no brilla su luz y no hay esperanza.

Una Alianza perfecta para un pueblo que está dormido, que no conoce a Dios y que se va muriendo en su silencio por el pecado. Un pueblo ignorante que no es capaz de abrir sus ojos para ver y abrir sus oídos para escuchar.

Ver, escuchar, entender y discernir el sacrificio perfecto que Cristo hace en la cruz, al derramar su sangre cuando fue clavado, para que nosotros podamos salir de la nube que nos cubre llenándonos de miedo y poder escuchar esa voz de Dios que nos dice: “este es mi Hijo, mi escogido; escúchenlo”. Abrir los ojos y ver a Cristo, y seguirlo para caminar en su **luz y esplendor**. Dios les ayude. Diácono Mariano Preza.

■ **LOS TRES PILARES DE LA CUARESMA**



Durante la Cuaresma, estamos llamados a utilizar los tres elementos que el Evangelio recomienda para el crecimiento espiritual que son: la oración, el ayuno y la limosna. El Miércoles de Ceniza del año pasado, el Papa Francisco pronunció una homilía centrada en una línea del Profeta Joel: “Rasgad vuestros corazones, no vuestros vestidos.” El Profeta, dijo el Papa, “nos recuerda que la conversión no puede reducirse a formas externas o resoluciones vagas, sino que implica y transforma la existencia entera, a partir del centro de la persona, la conciencia.”

**Oración:** La oración es cuando bajamos el volumen de nuestra propia voz y del ruido del mundo externo y nos abrimos a la presencia de Dios. En esta Cuaresma, aumentemos la calidad, no sólo la cantidad de oración. Mejorar el tiempo con Dios “desconectarnos” de la TV, teléfonos, iPod, computadoras y la radio del coche. Si usted está más cómodo con la oración activa o externa, trate de mantener un diario, leer los salmos en voz alta o cantar la música sagrada. Invite a su cuerpo a la oración a través de una meditación activa, meditar caminando.

**Ayuno y Abstinencia:** Es dejar las acciones y objetos que es atractivo a nuestro ideal físico. Renunciar a los dulces, el alcohol, la cafeína puede mejorar nuestra salud física, pero tenemos que preguntarnos: ¿nuestro sacrificio mejora nuestra vida espiritual? Queremos responder sí. Tal vez, ayuno son evitar

aquellas tentaciones que nos separan de Dios tales como el enojo, la culpa. Festejar el perdón, la afirmación y el bien común es la respuesta esta Cuaresma.

**Limosna:** La limosna es una manera poderosa de reconocer nuestras bendiciones. Resulta tentador identificar lo que no tenemos y lo que en nuestras vidas no está disponible. Es Dios quien da de todo en la vida, todos los dones. Esto incluye los dones que nos permiten ganar comodidad, dinero y seguridad. Afirmamos esto cuando conectamos nuestra limosna a nuestro agradecimiento.

■ **CUARESMA 2016: UNA CUESTIÓN DE MISERICORDIA**

Manteniendo nuestro tema del Año Jubilar de la Misericordia, **Abriendo las puertas a la Misericordia**, nuestro “subtema” para esta Cuaresma es “Una cuestión de Misericordia.” Cada semana vamos a reflexionar sobre diferentes aspectos de la misericordia en nuestras vidas, tales como: ¿Cómo recibimos la misericordia de Dios?
