**THOUGHTS FROM FR. RICHARD

■ DEACON MARIANO TO RETIRE

Deacon Mariano Preza will be retiring from his role on our pastoral staff as coordinator of our parish ministry to the Spanish-speaking community, at the end of the year.

Because of health problems, his doctor has prescribed a six-week sabbatical rest, to begin October 16. After the sabbatical, Deacon Mariano will return to work, serving in a period of transition until the end of the year, when he will retire officially as a member of our pastoral staff.

Mariano will continue to serve as a deacon in our parish community, serving liturgically to celebrate funerals, weddings, baptisms and quinceañeras, but will no longer serve as administrator of the pastoral ministry.

After the preparation of a new job description, we will begin a process to find and to hire a new person to be the new pastoral administrator of the Spanish-speaking community.

Mariano has served the Spanish-speaking community for the last 31 years, beginning with the previous Concord Hispanic Community. We will have an opportunity to thank and honor Mariano as the year comes to an end, before he retires.

■ FR. THOMAS WRITES ABOUT HIMSELF

Fr. S. Thomas SJ is an Indian Jesuit priest. He was born on August 9, 1980, in Karnataka State (South West India), in a city called Mysore. Soon after his schooling, at the age of 18, he joined the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) in Bangalore. Fr. Thomas finished all his 14 years of studies for the priesthood in different parts of India, and was ordained on December 8, 2012, in Mysore. Soon after his ordination, he served as an associate pastor of St. Francis Xavier Church of Bangalore Archdiocese for 6 months. Fr. Thomas arrived in Berkeley to further his studies in theology — Licentiate in Sacred Theology

(STL) in Fall 2013. Soon after his STL studies, he was asked to continue his Doctorate in Sacred Theology (STD), so as to teach theology back in India. He is a great fan of Pope Francis, so he is focusing his studies on *A Renewed Church for a Renewed Peoples*, from an Indian ecclesiological perspective. He is in his second year of doctoral studies, and he has volunteered to help us on the weekends. He has served one year in St. Andrew Kim Korean Catholic Church youth mass, and he has also served in St. Agnes Church at SFO for one month during the summer. A warm welcome to Fr. Thomas to our St. Bonaventure Church.

■ TEENS VOLUNTEER FOR MEXICO HOME BUILDING

The new nonprofit organization, La Morita Mexico Youth Mission, formerly a ministry of St. Agnes Parish, has reorganized and incorporated itself as its own non-profit organization. No longer officially sponsored by the Diocese of Oakland, the April 15-22 expedition is a caravan of goodwill that builds two to three homes each year in a Catholic parish in Tijuana, Mexico. Composed of teenager and adult supervisors, the adventure is an eye and heart-opening experience for each person who goes.

■ URGENT REQUEST FOR TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON RENT INCREASES AND UNFAIR EVICTIONS

Next weekend you will have an opportunity to sign a letter to the Concord City Council. Doing their due diligence, the Housing Committee of the Council is preparing to bring the possibility of new ordinances before the complete Council to offer a corrective to the rising apartment rents that have been erratic, over the top and excessive. For many years, stable and reasonable rents have provided housing for the majority of immigrant families in

Concord. A number of such dwellings are intentionally raising their rents, trying to turn the neighborhood into a gentrification of the neighborhoods. This will make it virtually impossible for families at the very lower end of the economic scale to continue to live in Concord.

“Well, let them go” say people who are ensconced in their owned and affordable homes and apartments. The fact is that a person would need to earn \$35/ hour to be able to afford the \$1825. monthly rent for a two-bedroom apartment. The problem affects the immigrant more seriously for sure, but even for many others as well.

No one knows how long it will take for the City Council to do anything or nothing. Next weekend you will have an opportunity to sign a letter to the City Council. The letter asks for two simple and immediate remedies:

1. To implement an immediate moratorium on rent increases above 3 percent, if no increase has been made in the prior 12 months; no increase to be made if there has been any increase in the prior 12 months.
2. To implement an immediate moratorium on evictions for unjust reasons.

The moratoriums would remain in effect until permanent ordinances can be developed and implemented.

St. Bonaventure Parish joins the coalition of faith, labor and community groups to ensure that the housing needs of all income groups are met in Concord. We urge you to sign this letter to the City Council of Concord, next weekend at all Masses.

■ 40 DAYS FOR LIFE

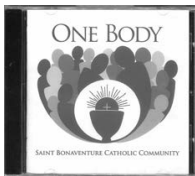

■ JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY –
Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary
Time



Though Jesus told today’s parable more than two thousand years ago, human nature hasn’t changed: we recognize both characters instantly. The merciless

judge represents the corruption that has short-circuited justice throughout history; the distraught widow, society’s perennially powerless, marginalized to what Pope Francis calls the “peripheries” by those who wield power but lack the mercy that could transfigure society with compassion. To confront such reality, Jesus bids us, “pray always without becoming weary” (Luke 18:1). Prayer opens our eyes to see others from Jesus’ perspective, and leads us to work for justice by coming to the aid of others with what Pope Francis extols as a higher standard, *mercy*. Thus, when Jesus asks, “Will not God secure the rights of [God’s] chosen ones? Will [God] be slow to answer?” (18:7). We respond by making God’s liberating work for others our own. “[W]hen the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?” (18:8). Yes, we respond—and mercy! —Peter Seagnelli, Copyright © J. S. 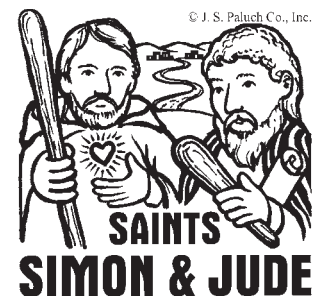

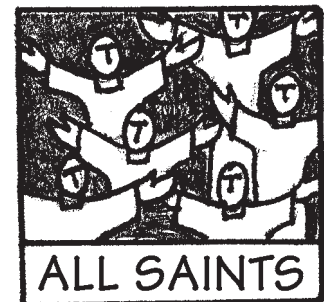

■ **TRUNK OR TREAT**

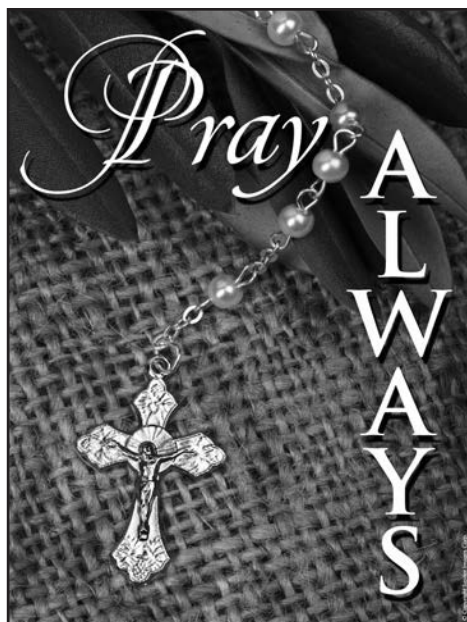

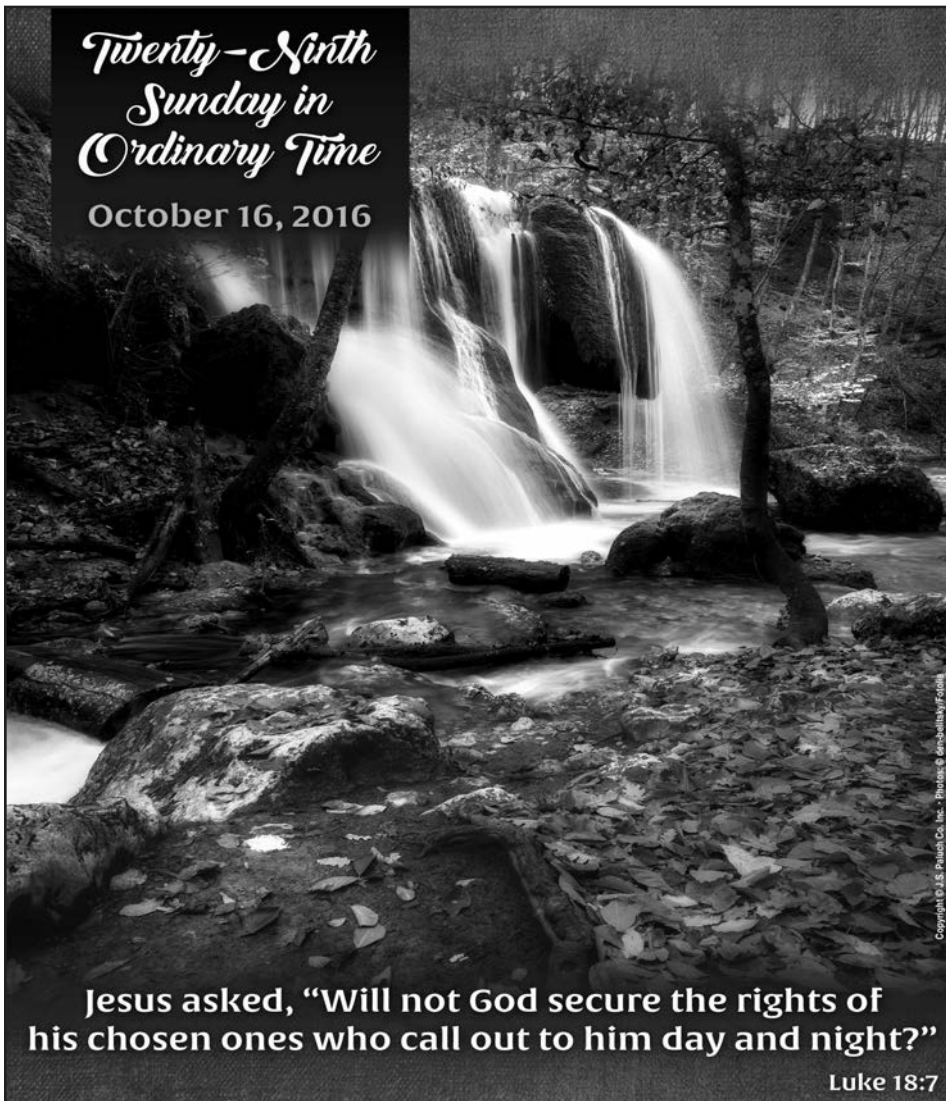

■ EVANGELIZACIÓN DE LOS PUEBLOS.

Hoy el Evangelio nos propone la parábola del juez inicuo, llamada también de la viuda inoportuna. Jesús estaba indicando a los suyos la importancia de orar sin desfallecer y les propone la parábola citada. Lógicamente las preguntas saltan inmediatamente en nuestro corazón y en nuestra mente. ¿Acaso no hemos visto personas que ante la muerte de un ser querido gritaban con desesperación que le habían pedido a Dios con mucha fe que sanara a su familiar...? ¿Acaso en las peticiones no concedidas donde más personas encuentran un motivo para alejarse de Dios...? Pero Jesús insiste que tenemos que orar sin desfallecer...

Para unas personas, Dios ha creado el mundo, pero luego se ha desentendido de él. Para otros absolutamente todo, hasta en las cosas más insignificantes de la existencia, Dios, está actuando. Como siempre tenemos que buscar el nivel necesario para descubrir la actuación de Dios en el mundo respetando la autonomía de la naturaleza y la libertad de las personas.

La oración no es para el cristiano algo accesorio o de simple conveniencia. Es algo imprescindible para entender la vida y lo que en ella nos pasa. Todos tenemos un diálogo interior con nosotros mismos. Estamos durante el día pensando y analizando nuestras vivencias interiores. En el cristiano ese diálogo personal interno queda iluminado por la perspectiva viva de Jesús. Ya el cristiano no dialoga individualmente consigo mismo sino que en su mente y en su oración siente la cercanía de Dios acompañante y hacedor del camino.

Muchos cristianos se mueven en un intimismo estéril. Piensan que una cosa es Dios al que deben albergar en su corazón, pero que no resiste el aire de la vida cuando sale al encuentro con los demás. Estos hermanos y hermanas viven lejos de la realidad. Su predicación del Evangelio es estéril porque lo que plantea y lo que vive lo hace desde la trinchera oculta para que nadie le “robe” a Dios en su corazón. Se olvidan estos amigos que Dios no tiene miedo a salir a la ventolera del mundo, es más, necesita respirar nuestro aire porque Dios se hizo hombre... Son raíces sin obras.

Otros hermanos se mueven en el universo contrario. El compromiso por el Evangelio no les deja tiempo para entrar dentro de sí y preparar al Señor una morada digna. Una morada que pasa por la sensatez, la fe, la esperanza y el amor... Están todo el día entregados a los pobres y a los necesitados, pero huyen del diálogo interior consigo mismo y con Cristo. Su Evangelio está a medias. Son obras sin raíces...

El Señor nos llama a orar siempre porque bien sabe que necesitamos raíces con obras. Hacer presente a Jesús en el mundo significa equilibrar estos dos aspectos que tanto hacen sufrir cuando van por separados. Centrar nuestra vida en Cristo es la tarea de toda nuestra existencia, pero centrarla no para guardar su presencia sino para que dé fruto abundante.

En el mundo que vivimos, donde tanto se premia la prontitud y la eficacia, se nos invita a entrar en otra dinámica totalmente nueva. Tenemos que entrar en el ritmo de Dios.

Cuando vivimos pegados al Señor salimos al mundo sin miedo porque el Espíritu Santo actúa en nosotros. Tenemos que orar con amor hacia Dios y hacia los demás. Muchas de las oraciones que hacemos están llenas de abatimiento, tristeza, amargura, desolación, de mil infelicidades. Podemos rezar desde esas situaciones pero no con esas actitudes. Si en plena batalla somos capaces de orar al Padre, al Hijo y al Espíritu Santo desde el amor, siempre encontraremos respuestas, quizá no la que deseamos, pero ten la seguridad que cuando oramos con amor Dios nunca se queda mudo.

El ser humano actual está perdiendo la escucha y el diálogo interior, es por ello que cada vez el vacío se hace más presente en muchas personas. Vivimos en una sociedad de sordomudos del interior.

La Palabra, la Oración y los Sacramentos son los medios que Dios nos ha dado para mantener un constante diálogo con El y con el mundo, de una manera muy especial con los más pobres y necesitados. Cuando vivimos estas tres dimensiones: Palabra-Oración-Sacramentos, Dios nunca quedará arrinconado en la caja fuerte de nuestro corazón para que nadie no lo

quite. Jesús quiere repartirse a todos y para todos, de ahí que nos dejó su Palabra, su Vida, su Cuerpo que se da por toda la eternidad. El que de verdad intenta seguir a Cristo tiene que tener un corazón lo suficientemente grande para que en el quepa toda la humanidad, y una vida lo suficientemente sintonizada con Dios para que a través de lo que hace se abra una ventana del cielo y las personas descubran a Cristo. Tenemos que confiar en los plazos de Dios.

Así, cuando Jesús pregunta: “¿creen ustedes acaso que Dios no hará justicia a sus elegidos? ¿Dios será lento para responder?” (18:7). 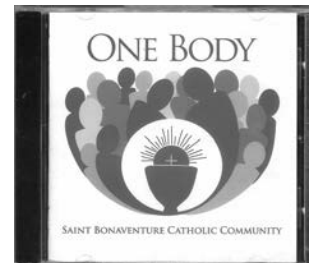
