THOUGHTS FROM FR. RICHARD
 PENSAMIENTOS DE PADRE RICARDO

■ **URGING OUR PARENTS NOT TO DISCONNECT CATECHISM FROM THE PRACTICE OF THEIR CHILDREN'S FAITH**

Our parish catechetical program ended a week ago. Rosann Halick, who directs our grammar school religious formation program for grades one to five, held a May Crowning to honor our Blessed Mother Mary. This end-of-program event also contained Gospel skits for the children, and an ice cream social. I also took the opportunity to speak to the parents as the Ice Cream Social was going on for the children.

I wanted to speak to the parents about their role as spiritual mentors for their children. I shared a few sentences from Pope Francis' new book on Marriage and Family life, called "The Joy of Love" in family life.

In Chapter 7 entitled "Toward a Better Education of Children," in a section called "Passing on the Faith," Pope Francis writes:

"The home must continue to be the place where we learn to appreciate the meaning and the beauty of Faith, to pray and to serve our neighbor."

"Parents are the means that God uses for it to grow and develop."

"Handing on the faith presumes that parents themselves genuinely trust God, seek him and sense their need for Him, for only in this way does one generation hand praises and gratitude on to God."

"Young parents need to be aware of their mission as the evangelizers of their own family."

I pointed out that the parents are the first teachers of the faith, that they are the first to hand it down by showing how they believe and pray and love. I then spoke of the great disconnect that Rosann and I see because parents enroll their children in catechism, but then do not bring their children to Sunday Mass. I said that we were concerned about what we see as the "Disconnect."

Did they see the disconnect? Why was that? Could they share their reasons and point of views? To tell you the truth, I could not get much conversation going. Maybe one or two persons shared something. Out of the three meetings, I learned a few things. Lots of people nodded that it is the issue of playing sports for their children. Some acknowledged that getting out of the habit was a big obstacle and that getting back into the habit was even more difficult. Working on Sundays was another, but not for too many. There was a lot of silence, which allowed me a little more time to try to motivate.

The fact is that children know what is important or not from what is important to their parents. I do not think that catechism, at its best, works once a week, even with the most creative and loving catechists. It is not enough for the gifts of Faith and Hope and Love to grow.

I shared with the parents that I cannot judge or measure how well they are doing as spiritual mentors because I do not know what is going on in their homes. I said that I hope that the parents were doing something good to nurture the living spirit

of faith and the souls of these beautiful children. I do hope that they are praying with their children and sharing about God in their family life.

I am reminded by Jesus in the Gospels that we are planting seeds that we may not see fully blossom. I think that we as ministers and teachers and passers on of the Faith need to have more Faith and Trust in God, especially when we will never see the end result of our work.

I urged them, at least, to come on the First Sundays of the month, where each class prepares a child-friendly liturgy, or to come every quarter, if not every Sunday. If it is a matter of not having the time, I challenged the parents to consult God and ask God to open their time to include what they think might be impossible to do. That perhaps will be the greatest challenge to their Faith, because God might just answer them, and then they would have to do it.

We live in hope. The Jewish faith tradition has an expression always used at the end of each year's Passover Supper, that those who celebrate the supper might celebrate it next year in Jerusalem. "Next Year in Jerusalem!" Next Year at Mass!

**JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY –
 May 15, 2016, Solemnity of
 Pentecost**



Announcing the *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pope Francis challenged us to proclaim God's mercy "to everyone without exception . . . again and again, with new enthusiasm and

renewed pastoral action" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 12). Pentecost proclaims that the door locked for fifty days is thrown open at last. No longer closed in on itself, the community speaks to crowds from different backgrounds, distant lands, exotic languages. Everyone hears their native language. The Spirit does not restore Babel's uniformity, but forges unity—in-diversity of language, race, nationality—embracing all without exception. During this *Jubilee Year of Mercy*, Pentecost's Spirit summons us afresh from mediocrity and isolation to share God's mercy with the world. "This is our mission!" Francis exclaims. We are "given the gift of the 'tongue' of the Gospel and the 'fire' of the Holy Spirit, so that while we proclaim Jesus risen, living and present in our midst, we may warm . . . the heart of the peoples, drawing near to Him, the way, the truth, and the life" (*Regina Coeli* address, Pentecost Sunday, May 24, 2015).

■ **PENTECOSTÉS, 15 DE MAYO, 2016**
JUAN 20: 19-23

A los que les perdonen los pecados, les quedarán perdonados; y a los que no se los perdonen, les quedarán sin perdonar”.

La celebración de nuestro cumpleaños es siempre motivo de alegría, de fiesta y de buenos augurios. Hoy los cristianos tenemos una razón especial para alegrarnos, festejar e intercambiar los mejores deseos porque celebramos el cumpleaños de la Iglesia de Cristo, de la cual somos miembros vivos y responsables. Hoy celebramos la fiesta de Pentecostés, palabra que significa “cincuenta días”, porque es el tiempo que la separa de otra gran festividad, la Pascua. Pascua es la fiesta de la luz, de la nueva vida que comienza con la resurrección de Cristo. Pentecostés es la celebración del don del Espíritu Santo que da comienzo a la Nueva Alianza y señala el nacimiento de la vida pública de la Iglesia. Nos es útil recordar que la fiesta de Pentecostés era celebrada por el pueblo judío mucho antes de la venida de Cristo. Al comienzo fue la fiesta de la siega, día de regocijo y de acción de gracias. En esa ocasión se ofrecía a Dios las primicias de lo que había producido la tierra. Era en el espíritu y la intención lo que es hoy para nosotros el

Día de Acción de Gracias, tan arraigado en los Estados Unidos. Luego Pentecostés pasó a ser una fiesta de aniversario de la alianza que tuvo lugar unos cincuenta días después de la salida de Egipto. Y el hecho de que hoy la Iglesia esté celebrando la fiesta de Pentecostés nos está diciendo que entre el Antiguo y el Nuevo Testamento, o Alianza, para usar una palabra más bíblica, no hay separación sino continuidad.

Los Hechos de los Apóstoles nos relatan la venida del Espíritu Santo como una grandiosa ‘teofanía’ o manifestación del poder de Dios. El viento huracanado y las lenguas de fuego son manifestaciones visibles del gran acontecimiento de la venida del Espíritu Santo que transformó a los Apóstoles y dio vida a la Iglesia. Un doble milagro acontece. Los Apóstoles comienzan a hablar en lenguas, una forma de oración carismática muy común en las primitivas comunidades cristianas. El hablar en lenguas, que de sí es ininteligible, es comprendido por todos los judíos que habían venido a Jerusalén para celebrar precisamente la fiesta de Pentecostés. Ese milagro fue una clara señal de la misión universal de la Iglesia, llamada a ser signo de unidad de los hombres entre sí y de los hombres con Dios, cualquiera sea su raza, lengua o color.

Pentecostés es el cumplimiento de diversos vaticinios que anunciaban la llegada del Espíritu, como el profeta Ezequiel quien predijo: “infundiré mi espíritu en ustedes para que vivan según mis mandatos”. Juan el Bautista había anunciado que el Mesías “Los bautizará en el Espíritu Santo”. El mismo Jesús confirmó esta promesa cuando dijo: “Juan bautizó con agua, pero ustedes serán bautizados en el soplo del Espíritu Santo dentro de pocos días”. Pentecostés es el coronamiento de la Pascua de Cristo, porque el mismo Señor quiso que fuera el Espíritu Santo quien completara su obra.

Decimos que en Pentecostés nació la Iglesia y comenzó el tiempo del Espíritu Santo, porque Pedro, lleno de una sabiduría, un valor y una elocuencia que hasta entonces no había conocido, pronunció su primer sermón proclamando la muerte y la resurrección de Cristo.

La Iglesia surgió a la vida pública y dio comienzo a la ingente tarea de evangelizar al mundo, no por la decisión de un grupo de personas, sino por la fuerza transformadora del Espíritu. La acción del Espíritu no fue una fuerza exterior, sino un impulso interior que comenzó transformando el corazón de los apóstoles. Esto nos está diciendo que nosotros seremos auténticos apóstoles de Cristo si nos dejamos transformar, renovar profundamente por la acción del Espíritu.

Pentecostés, como la resurrección de Cristo, fue un hecho que aconteció una vez, pero perdura como modelo de otras intervenciones del Espíritu. En este sentido la Iglesia vive un permanente Pentecostés, porque el Espíritu no cesa de comunicarse y sigue guiando a la Iglesia con su luz y su fuerza interior. Permanentemente surgen en la Iglesia movimientos apostólicos, nuevas comunidades, santos modernos para renovar a la Iglesia con la fuerza del Espíritu. La Torre de Babel fue el símbolo de la desunión y la falta de entendimiento de los hombres entre sí.

Pentecostés, es la respuesta de Dios a un mundo dividido que solamente en el amor del Espíritu Santo podrá encontrar el camino de la verdadera unidad y fraternidad. Cristo en el evangelio de hoy nos trae la paz, nos envía por el mundo y nos da al Espíritu Santo para el perdón de nuestros pecados. Pentecostés debe ser, entonces, una fiesta que señale un cambio profundo en nuestras vidas.

Nos espera a todos una gran tarea: evangelizar al mundo, transformarnos para transformar, renovarnos para renovar. Que el Espíritu Santo sea desde hoy nuestra guía, nuestra luz y que nos haga comprender lo que hasta ahora no habíamos entendido, y que este Pentecostés sea para cada uno de nosotros el comienzo de una nueva vida de compromiso y acción.
