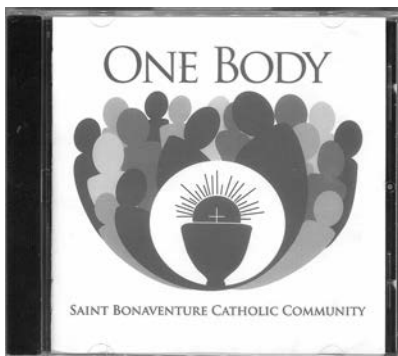

■ **JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY –
Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary
Time: Jubilee of Marian Devotion
begins next Saturday**



“How long, O LORD?” (Habakkuk 1:2). With Habakkuk’s question echoing across twenty-six hundred years, Respect Life Sunday finds all life claiming sanctuary in our hearts: unborn infant, senior citizen, immigrant and refugee, imprisoned and addicted, people burdened with illness and disabilities of body, mind, or spirit. Even Mother Earth, Pope Francis notes in *Laudato Si’*, bears scars of disrespect for the life she nurtures and sustains. Life is still threatened, as in Habakkuk’s day, with ruin and misery, “destruction and violence, ... strife and clamorous discord” (see 1:3). Since our efforts so often seem ineffective, we “unprofitable servants” cry with the apostles, “Increase our faith” (Luke 17:10, 5). But Jesus’ reply might be paraphrased, “Not quantity—quality.” Next weekend marks the *Jubilee Year of Mercy’s* special devotion to Mary, whose willingness to shelter Jesus in her womb and stand at the foot of his cross bears witness to the qualities that Jesus expects our faith to manifest: the willingness to trust, to risk, and to dare to speak up for life.

- funeral planning

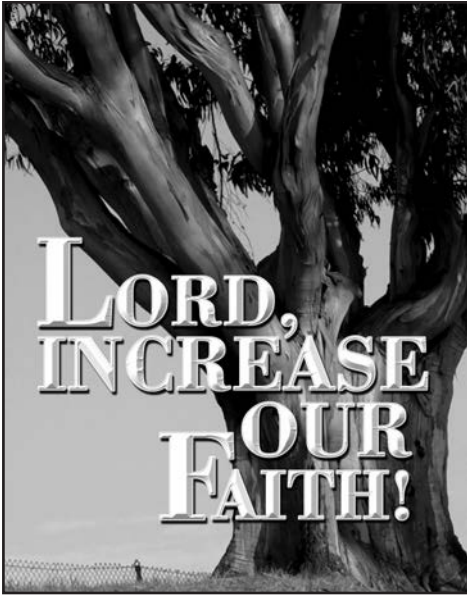

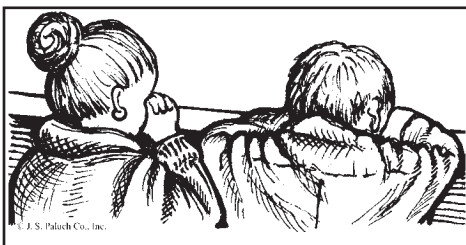

■ LUCAS 17, 5-10

En aquel tiempo, los apóstoles dijeron al Señor: “Aumentanos la fe.” El Señor les contestó: “Si tuvieran fe, aunque fuera tan pequeña como una semilla de mostaza, podrían decir a ese árbol frondoso: ‘Arráncate de raíz y plántate en el mar,’ y los obedecería.

¿Quiénes de ustedes, si tiene un siervo que labra la tierra o pastorea los rebaños, le dice cuando regrese del campo: ‘Entra enseguida y ponte a comer?’ ¿No le dirá más bien: ‘Prepárame de comer y disponte a servirme, para que yo coma y beba; después comerás y beberás tú?’ ¿Tendrá acaso que mostrarse agradecido con el siervo, porque éste cumplió con su obligación?

Así también ustedes, cuando hayan cumplido todo lo que se les mandó, digan: ‘No somos más que siervos, sólo hemos hecho lo que teníamos que hacer.’”

Mover las Montañas del rencor, del pecado, de la lujuria, del orgullo no Mt. Diablo

Una de las preguntas que con más frecuencia hacen los incrédulos es: “¿Para qué sirve la fe? ¿Acaso el que tiene fe no va a caer en el paro, en la enfermedad, en la ruptura matrimonial, en la depresión...? ¿Para qué sirve entonces tener fe?”

En un mundo tan utilitarista como el nuestro las cosas se buscan para que “sirvan” para algo. Vale lo que me sirve. Es inútil lo que no me aporta nada. Esa es la concepción que tienen muchas personas de nuestro mundo. La fe se mueve en otras claves totalmente diferentes. La fe no es una conquista humana, ni se compra, ni se obtiene por el propio esfuerzo personal. La fe es un magnífico regalo que Dios nos hace.

La búsqueda constante de Dios debe ser la tarea más urgente en nuestra vida. Tenemos fe, claro que tenemos fe, pero nunca nos olvidemos que es una fe llena de tentaciones. Una fe que sucumbe muchas veces con cierta facilidad. Unas veces pueden más las tentaciones que la propia fe, de ahí que tengamos los creyentes que estar más atentos a ejercitar nuestra vida cristiana en todos los aspectos. Quien

no vive en intensidad lo que cree tarde o temprano termina por debilitarse.

Los Apóstoles piden al Señor que les aumente la fe ya que sin ella quedarán incapacitados para entender y vivir el Reino de Dios. Nuestra fe tiene que estar cimentada en Cristo por encima de todas las circunstancias de la vida. Mi fe no se sostiene porque tenga unas severas leyes morales ni tan siquiera porque tenga conceptos teológicos sólidos. Mi fe está anclada y alimentada en Cristo Resucitado. Mi diálogo interior y mi oración no son conmigo mismo o un diálogo con las ideas que se mueven en mi mente. Mi fe no es un sentimiento. Mi fe es un asentimiento y un experimentar al Señor vivo en mi vida. El Señor que me salva y me da vida.

Situaciones como la enfermedad, la injusticia, la ruptura matrimonial, la muerte propia y la de un ser querido se viven de manera muy distinta con fe que sin ella. La creencia y la confianza en Jesús nos aportan nuevas claves, las claves del Reino de Dios, para poder interpretar y vivir adecuadamente a la altura de hijos de un Padre Bueno todas las circunstancias que aparecen en nuestro diario vivir.

El Evangelio de hoy nos recuerda que la humildad tiene que ser un elemento fundamental en el seguimiento del Señor. Ser humilde es reconocer nuestras limitaciones y debilidades y en actuar de acuerdo con este conocimiento. ¿Somos personas lo suficientemente sensatas y espiritualmente equilibradas para descubrir nuestras pobreza internas?

Por mucho que hagamos en el servicio del Señor siempre tenemos que mantenernos en la actitud de humildad. No soy yo quien he optado de manera unilateral por Cristo. Algo así como hacer una concesión a Dios en mi vida. Es Jesús vivo quien me invita a seguirle y yo respondo desde mi fe con agradecimiento. La cosa no es realizar muchos trabajos pastorales ni tan siquiera sacrificarse, la respuesta es amar intensamente al Señor y dejar que sea El quien nos acompañe en el camino de la vida. Todo lo demás tiene que ser una derivación de ese primer amor en el seguimiento.

Hay cristianos llenos de sufrimiento más que de amor porque el mundo que imaginan en su mente no se parece en nada al mundo real. Sufren porque existe una ruptura entre el ideal y la realidad. Más que en el amor de Dios viven en los propios esquemas personales y eso les produce un dolor intenso.
