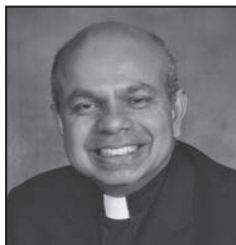

Dear Parishioners,

The third Sunday of Advent is called "Gaudete Sunday" because the Mass for today (in its original Latin text), begins with the opening antiphon: "Gaudete in Domino semper"—"Rejoice in the Lord always." To remind ourselves that we are preparing for the very joyful occasion of the birth of Jesus, we light the rose candle, and the priest will wear rose vestments. The common theme of the day's Scripture readings is one of joy and encouragement. The readings urge us to make the preparations required of us as we await the rebirth of Jesus in our hearts and lives. Holy Scripture reminds us that the coming of Jesus, past, present and future, is the reason for our rejoicing.



The Prophet Isaiah, in the first reading, encourages the Jewish exiles returning from Babylon to rejoice because their God, Yahweh, is their strong guide, provider and protector. St. Paul, in the second reading, advises the Thessalonian Christians to "rejoice always" by leading blameless, holy and thankful lives guided by the Holy Spirit, because Christ's second coming is near, and he is faithful in his promise to reward them. Today's Gospel tells us that John the Baptist came to bear witness to Jesus as the light of the world. The Baptizer wants all the Jews to rejoice because the long-expected messiah, as the light of the world, will remove the darkness of sin from the world.

Our mission as brothers and sisters of Christ and members of his Church is to reflect Christ's light to others, just as the moon reflects the light of the sun. It is especially important during the Advent season that we reflect Christ's sharing love and his unconditional forgiveness. Let us bring the true light of Christ to illumine the lives of all these brothers and sisters during this Advent season through our sharing love, overflowing mercy, unconditional forgiveness and humble service. We will be able to accomplish this witnessing mission of radiating Christ's light by performing the corporal and spiritual works of mercy where we see these are needed.

May I invite you to come to the parish communal penance service and individual confessions on Tuesday, December 19 at 7:30 p.m. We will have 10 priests to assist us.

CHRISTMAS EVE PARKING

ENTRANCE ACCESS:

All vehicles are to enter the parish parking lot through the Clayton Road entrance. The gate at Indiana Drive is for Exit only. Please do not park on Indiana Drive.

EXIT:

All vehicles in the southwest (back) lot are to exit through the Indiana Drive gate. All vehicles in the northeast (front) lot are to exit through the Clayton Road exit. Crossing over between lots will congest traffic and create a safety issue.

HANDICAPPED PARKING:

We have 14 designated Handicapped Parking spaces. We know this is insufficient for heavy attendance Masses. We encourage those who can walk the distance to park accordingly and leave the handicapped spaces for those most in need. Your handicap placard must be clearly displayed.

NO PARKING AREAS:

- Parking in front of the rectory garage is prohibited.
- Striped areas at the ends of rows and red curbs anywhere on the property are no-parking areas. Vehicles parked in these areas may be ticketed and towed. We must observe the City Codes that require emergency vehicle access to the property.
- Parking on Farm Bureau property is strictly prohibited. Your vehicle may be towed.
- Our neighbors strongly request that we not park on the local streets, since it leaves no parking for their friends or family who might be visiting. We encourage you to honor their needs. Any car parking in such a way that a residential driveway is blocked may be towed.

IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING DECEMBER 23/24/25 MASS OBLIGATIONS

This year the celebration of Christmas, the Solemnity of the Nativity of Our Lord, falls on a Monday. The Church asks us to attend Mass on both Sunday, December 24, the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and on the Feast of Christmas, since the Nativity of the Lord remains a Holy Day of Obligation. The 5:00pm Mass on Saturday, December 23 and the morning Masses on Sunday, December 24 will fulfill the obligation for the Fourth Sunday of Advent. Masses on the afternoon/evening of December 24 and the morning of December 25 will fulfill the Christmas obligation.

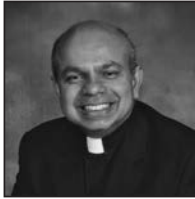

Estimados Feligreses:

El tercer domingo de Adviento se llama "Domingo Gaudete," porque la misa de hoy (en su texto original en latín,) comienza con la antífona de apertura: "Gaudete in Domino Semper" – "Siempre alégrese en el Señor." Para recordar que estamos preparando la ocasión muy alegre del nacimiento de Jesús, encendemos la vela color de rosa y el sacerdote viste vestimentas de color rosa. El tema común de las lecturas bíblicas del día son de alegría y ánimo. Las lecturas nos impulsan hacer los preparativos necesarios mientras esperamos el renacimiento de Jesús en nuestros corazones y vidas. La Sagrada Escritura nos recuerda que la venida de Jesús, pasado, presente y futuro es la razón de nuestra alegría.



El profeta Isaías, en la primera lectura, anima a los judíos exilados que regresaban de Babilonia a alegrarse porque su Dios, el Señor, es su guía fuerte, proveedor y protector. El Evangelio de hoy nos dice que Juan el Bautista vino a dar testimonio de Jesús como la luz del mundo. El Bautista quiere que todos los judíos se regocijen porque el Mesías esperado tanto tiempo como la luz del mundo, eliminará la oscuridad del pecado del mundo.
